

College Admissions Update

CLT deep dive



What is the CLT?

The CLT is a college entrance exam for 11th & 12th graders that serves as an alternative to the SAT and ACT. In the state of Florida, students can utilize the CLT

- apply to all Florida state universities
- satisfy graduation requirements as a testing concordant score
- earn Bright Futures scholarships
- become eligible for dual enrollment

If you've taken AP English, AP History, or dual enrollment humanities courses, the CLT content will feel familiar. Students who struggle with the SAT's data analysis sections or the ACT's science reasoning often find the CLT more approachable.

If you find yourself in the predicament where you are constantly retesting for the ACT and SAT and not receiving scores that demonstrate your academics, give the CLT a try!


Rising 12th - Finalizing your college list.
