**College Admissions Update** 



It's extremely exciting to say we are well into the 2025-26 school year. For some of you, this marks the beginning of your high school journey and for others you are actively submitting applications for a journey that soon awaits you!

As you continue through the first semester of school, setting goals is one of the best ways to stay motivated and on track throughout the school year. However, some goals can be easily forgotten.

We encourage you to create **SMART Goals**. Make your goals:

- **Specific** What are you trying to accomplish?
- Measurable How will you measure if you achieved this goal or not?
- Attainable Are these goals that can be reached in a school year?
- Relevant Do your shorter term goals align with larger goals?
- **Timely** How quickly do you want to achieve these goals?

We don't want you to just forget about these goals! Keep them somewhere you'll see them often and check in on your progress. Revisit them weekly or at the end of each grading period to measure how you're doing and make adjustments if needed.

# 9th- Discover your passions early.

Your 9th grade year is the perfect time to explore activities that spark your interest. As college admissions become more competitive, starting early is going to set you apart!

Getting involved is about discovering what excites you in your school community and in your future career interests.

#### **Key Tips:**

- Prioritize meaningful involvement: Commit to one or two activities that genuinely interest you. Colleges value sustained involvement more than a long list of fleeting activities.
- Try new things: Use this year to test the waters. Join a club you've never considered or try a new sport. Every experience helps you understand yourself better.

Exploring activities helps build important life skills, ignite your passions, and open doors to future leadership. These organizations can make your high school experience meaningful.

#### 10th- PSAT scores released.

Most 10th grade students take the PSAT in early October! Test scores are set to early in late October to early November.

You should use these scores to

- understand the structure of standardized tests that will be used for college admissions
- your college readiness based on your math and reading/writing scores.
  - 10th grade **Reading/Writing**:430 **Math**:480
  - 11th grade Reading/Writing:460 Math:510

The SAT will be an exam similar to PSAT you will begin taking in August of your junior year. Emphasize these exams as they will be crucial for college admissions.

# 11th - College/University planning starts NOW!

As a junior, now is also the time to start thinking about college. Research schools that interest you, explore their programs, and begin preparing for the SAT or ACT using official practice materials.

When researching a school:

- Check the universities or colleges website: Look for *Admissions* or *About* sections to see what they have to offer academically and culturally.
- Find the admitted student profile: See average GPA, test scores, and other stats to know what the school looks for and how you are measuring up.
- Compare schools: Note GPA, score and programs to find the best fit. This will help you create a balanced college list in the spring.

Tip: Use this research to set goals and plan your courses/extracurriculars!

Remember they look at you holistically, not just your test scores or GPA.

# 12th - Finalizing your college list.

The activities list demonstrates your extracurricular and volunteer activities you have been working throughout all of high school. When filling out the Activities section of the Common App, it's important to describe your extracurriculars clearly and accurately!

#### **Key Points:**

- Start each description with a strong action verb. Check out <u>Harvard's action</u>
   verbs by skill set!
- Maintain consistent formatting for all activities.
- Quantify the impact of each activity with specific numbers or measurable results.
- Highlight 2-3 distinct responsibilities you completed.

Remember, admissions officers review hundreds of applications, so clarity and specificity matter. Avoid vague descriptions like "club member" and instead show what you did and how you made a difference.

Your extracurriculars are part of your story! Make them count. Use this outline to draft your <u>activities list.</u> Once this is completed, submit them to the Writing team to offer support on the descriptions.
